



Water shutoffs in Detroit since 2014




There have been more than 102,000 water shutoffs in Detroit between 2014 and 2017.

Risk of Water Privatization


- * 197 billion litres of sewage flushed into waterways
- * 36% of wastewater and 29% of drinking water infrastructure is rated poor/fair condition
- * Water infrastructure gap for municipalities. \$61 billion [gap] \$2 billion
- * 4.6 billion committed by Federal government to end the 100+ DWAs in First Nations communities. But only covers 70% of total needed investments.
- * Market-logic (food and drug examples, Hamilton, Detroit, global examples)



Thames River Watershed




Land Use for Lake Erie basin



Lake Erie Watershed






Regulatory Failures
